


The spatial construct that aims to build dissenting bodies

dissolving it and generating public voids, thus turning an invisible


[PROPOSED]

space into a space for dissent.



[ACCESS]

This alternative underground public ground encounters, confronts, or intersects with the existing public surface. The space is thus redefined as both a field of resistance and a site of encounter.



[DESCENT]

The emerging public voids carry the dissenting spatial constructs underground, into the depths of what has been silenced. This new ground exists apart from the normative public realm represented by the surface.
